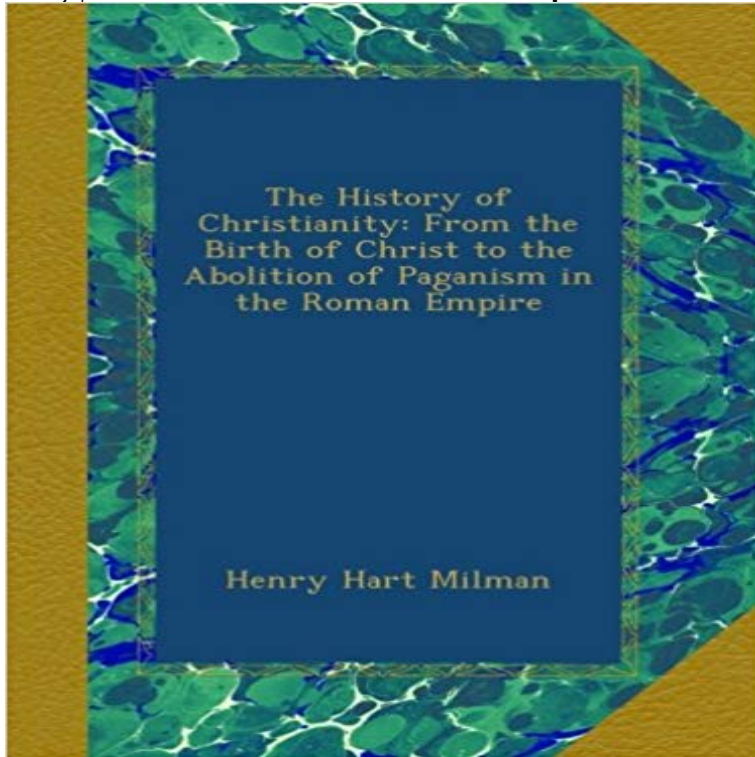


The History of Christianity: From the Birth of Christ to the Abolition of Paganism in the Roman Empire
