

The Korean Question and U.S Forces in South Korea



While South Korea has been portrayed in the main-stream media as a staunch ally of the United States, the situation on the ground is actually quite different. In a December 2012 survey of national attitudes, conducted in forty-two countries by the Pew Research Center, a stunning 44 percent of South Koreans were found to hold unfavorable views of the United States. This level of disaffection topped France's 34 percent, Germany's 35 percent, and in fact, any country in Europe or East Asia. In the non-Muslim world, only Argentina, whose economy was in ruins for two years (arguably done in by the neoliberal nostrums pushed by Washington) was shown to harbor more unhappy sentiments vis-a-vis the United States.
